

Missouri Spinners

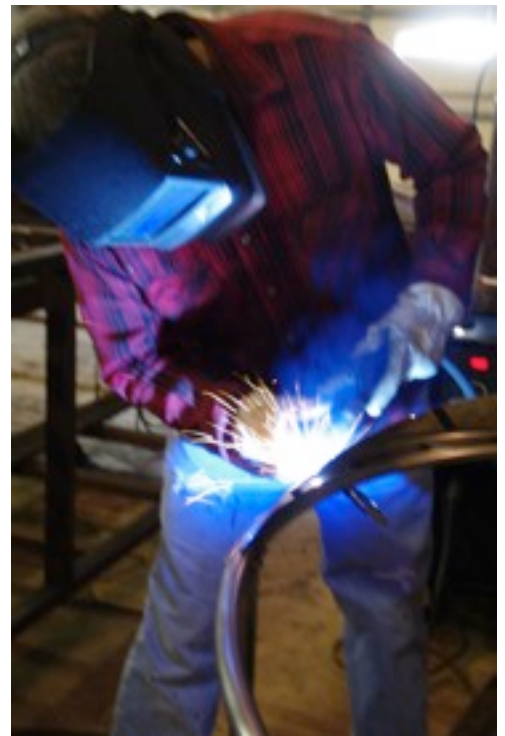

Missouri Spinners are hand crafted by a local artist deep in the Ozarks. They are wind sculptures that turn and move freely with the slightest breeze. Each piece of wind art looks to move as directed by silent breezes but in reality they are contemporary weathervanes. These wind spinners are carefully engineered and meticulously constructed from the highest quality steel. Locals and tourist have called them "Decorative Windmills". But actually they are kinetic art forms. The stainless steel blades turn effortlessly in the slightest breeze giving the observer a reflective piece of light that has mesmerizing effects. Inside Chris's studio a local skilled craftsman produces each wind machine by hand. These are truly beautiful landscape sculptures that grab the attention of passers by and call for a few moments of reflective relaxation.

Today Chris and Tony work in a 5000 sq. ft. shop and produce Missouri Spinners one at a time as many as one a week. Each Spinner is made by hand. Chris will tell you as you visit his workshop, "Every one we build is given the most scrutinizing care." They are wind sculptures that turn and move freely with the slightest breeze. Each piece of wind art looks to move as directed by silent breezes. They are contemporary weather vanes.

As you approach a Missouri spinner, you will feel the urge to slow down and take a closer look. The spinner will be telling the speed and direction of the wind, but it will also be reminding you of a day that has gone by. It will be reminding you of a time when the pace of life was a little slower, and a little softer. It will lull you into relaxation and memories of windmills and soft summer breezes. It casts brilliant shimmers of light from the stainless blades that gently accompany you to a calmer state. When you see one of their kinetic sculptures keep in mind Chris and Tony will be somewhere in the back of their 5000 sq. ft. studio deep in the hills of Missouri working on the construction of a new Missouri Spinner.

Generally it takes two people about thirty minutes to move it into place and secure it to the ground. We have delivered as many as four at a time to some clients and we have shipped them as far north as Madison Wisconsin. We have sold them through landscape companies where they were re-sold as kinetic sculptures for high-end yard gardens. We have shipped them to New York City, and as far south as Tubac, Arizona. They are a highly visible sculpture that brings attention to any business where they are prominently displayed. The standard color is black, but they can be painted in any color that client chooses.
